DIGEST OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL DECISIONS, 20 April 2020

- 1) Guideline proposal for the issuance of diplomas and other related documents was discussed and unanimously accepted.
- 2) The following criteria has been unanimously accepted for the evaluation of Internal Transfer applicants to the College of Economics and Administrative Sciences.
- Applied students must have taken at least 2 (two) Required Area courses from their current program.
- Applied students must have taken at least 3 (three) Required and / or area elective courses from the program they apply to.
- In order for the scholarship students to carry their scholarship to the new program, they need to have a GPA greater than or equal to the previous term GPA of scholarship students in that program or an area GPA for the courses relating to the new program greater than or equal to the GPA of scholarship students in that program.
- In case a scholarship student wants to transfer without scholarship, the Faculty Executive Council evaluates the student's application. (Provided that it complies with the conditions in Articles 1 and 2)
- For students without scholarship, they should have a GPA greater than or equal to the previous semester GPA of non-scholarship students in that program or an area GPA for courses relating to the new program greater than or equal to the GPA of scholarship students in that program.
- 3) The proposal to waive the following rule to be limited to the Spring 2020 period was accepted unanimously.

In accordance with the decision taken in the Academic Committee of September 2013, students can withdraw from up to 3 of the courses they have taken as an overload course load during their education period except for Exchange Programs and Summer Periods.

The number of courses that existing students received W grade before 2013 Fall semester will not be included in this total.

4) The proposal to give Pass Students / Fail grade option for the amnesty exams of the courses taken in the Spring 2020 period has been unanimously accepted as follows.

For amnesty exams to be taken until the end of the September 2020 amnesty exam period, students can choose Pass / Fail grading option regardless of the term of the respective course. Pass / Fail grading option cannot be used for amnesty exams taken after September 2020 amnesty period.

Regarding the Spring 2020 course enrollments, students can also use the Pass / Fail grading option in the overall grades after the final remedial and make-up exams.
